Happy Fiscal New Year! We have wrapped up our Neighborhood Council elections for the next two years. BIG thanks to EmpowerLA's election outreach team, led by Director of Outreach and Communications, Tom Soong, as well as all of our staff for doing an amazing amount of outreach in our targeted areas. We will now be focused on writing our report back to City Council on the election results. We'll also be holding some citywide townhalls to debrief the elections with Neighborhood Councils so please let us know what worked and what needs to work better. More details about this under the Outreach section of the profile. Many thanks to our partners, the Office of the City Clerk and the City Attorney's Office, for their assistance during the elections! We hope you have had or will have an opportunity to attend our Leadership Academy, online Cornerstone training, or Neighborhood Council Civic University 1.0. This education will provide you with some foundational training for your role as an advocate for your community. Please remember that we are here to assist your Neighborhood Council in succeeding because your one success benefits the entire Neighborhood Council system.

Citywide Campaigns

As you know, filing Community Impact Statements is one of the ways Neighborhood Councils can weigh in officially on City Council files. Neighborhood Councils filed the most Community Impact Statements last year with 648. Congratulations to Los Feliz Neighborhood Council for being the number one filer in the City with 60 Community Impact Statements!!

Admin

Fiscal year 2018-19 has come to a close and we are grateful to our many partners, both Neighborhood Council members and City partners that helped us innovate and pilot new services such as the online Cornerstone training interface and the Canva platform. We look forward to further innovations including an updated website, and case management and tracking application. Please continue to follow us by subscribing to our newsletter, and following us on social media for the latest news.

Field

The Department will be working with our NCs in the coming months to implement the reforms.

Also, with the 2020 Census moving to an online survey, EmpowerLA is participating in the Census 2020 by volunteering a computer site to assist stakeholders complete the Census. These computer sites are being referred to as Census Action Kiosk sites. Los Angeles County ranks as the hardest-to-count county in the nation. Hard-to-count areas include neighborhoods with limited access to the internet, those with high concentrations of renters and homeless people, and immigrant communities that may not participate in the

Census due to language barriers or fear of reprisal by the federal government. As a reminder, per the Mayor Garcetti's [Executive Directive No. 20](#) the City will not assist or cooperate with any effort by federal immigration agents to use public facilities or resources for the purposes of enforcing federal civil immigration law. Funding

The Administrative Packet for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 can be submitted through the Funding portal starting July 1, 2019. The Admin Packet allows your Board to plan and create its annual budget, confirm the Financial Officers serving your Board, and to confirm or let us know of any administrative services, i.e. storage space, website support, for the upcoming Fiscal Year. Please visit our [website](#) to download the Packet. You'll find it in the Documents and Forms section, under Governing Documents. Plan on submitting your Admin Packet starting July 1st in order to gain access to your annual funds when the Fiscal Year begins. NCs that have not submitted an annual budget and Administrative Packet to the NC Funding Program when the new Fiscal Year begins will be limited to \$333.00/month for Office/Operational expenditures only. On August 1st, Funding Program will begin notifying NCs of their Fiscal Year 2018/2019 account closing balance which will include the amount of funds available for rollover. As a reminder, NCs now have the ability to rollover up to \$10,000 of unspent funds from one Fiscal Year to the next, on a non-cumulative basis. Outreach

Elections for all 13 Regions have been completed. What a journey! We thank the City Clerk staff for their assistance as over 22000+ voters got involved with our election process. We will be compiling information and doing after election surveys. 3 feedback sessions will be held in the Valley, Central/East, and South/Harbor Areas. We are securing locations but save the dates for July 30, July 31, and August 1st. An after election report will be done describing the methods of outreach used, what worked, and best practices. Policy

Civic U emphasizes civic and community engagement and gives Neighborhood Council leaders the tools they need to understand city government and influence policy at City Hall. Since the first Civic U, over 300 Angelenos have completed and graduated the program. The Department of Neighborhood Empowerment/EmpowerLA in collaboration with the Mayor's Office and Cal State LA Pat Brown Institute, invite each Neighborhood Council to select one male and one female to the cohort of Civic U 1.0. Civic U 1.0 will be held on Monday, July 15, 22, and 29 from 6 pm - 9 pm. Space is limited, so please [register](#) by Friday, July 5. "We cannot build a better Los Angeles without an engaged population that knows how to navigate city government," said Mayor Garcetti. "That's why the Civic U emphasizes civic literacy: it's not just about your vote at the ballot box, it's about making sure your elected officials are representing your interests." Instructors will be under the supervision of Dr. Raphael Sonenshein, Executive Director of the Pat Brown Institute (PBI), and author of three books on Los Angeles politics and government. Teaching staff, guest speakers, and group

facilitators will be drawn from the Pat Brown Institute (PBI), Cal State LA Faculty, the Mayor's Office, other city offices, the Center for Nonprofit Management, and trained by the Pat Brown Institute.

Please join us at the upcoming Board of Neighborhood Commissioners meeting on Tuesday, July 2 at 6 pm at City Hall East Controller's Conference Room 351 located at 200 North Main Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012. Agenda items include discussion and possible action regarding training for the neighborhood council board members. Discussion may include creating policies for mandated leadership and conflict resolution for board members and candidates. In addition, the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners will be hosting town hall meetings on creating policies for mandated leadership and conflict resolution for board members and candidates in August and September.

The next Homelessness Liaison meeting will be on Tuesday, July 30 from 6:30 pm - 8:30 pm at the Controller's Conference Room 351 located at City Hall East (200 North Main Street). The Los Angeles City Council will be on its summer recess from Friday, July 5 to Friday, July 26. Thank you to the many Neighborhood Councils for submitting Community Impact Statements. Over 600 Community Impact Statements were submitted during FY 18-19. City Clerk Election Administration

The 2019 Neighborhood Council Elections are now complete. The City Clerk will coordinate with the Department on scheduling post-election town halls to obtain feedback on the election process. Our office will also be contacting your board to arrange for your election records pick-up. Stakeholder Registration Forms, candidate filing applications, and ballots will become available 90 days after your election was certified. NCs must designate a representative to pick up the records from our office. If your NC does not pick up these documents, which are very useful for ongoing stakeholder outreach, these materials will be disposed of in accordance with the City's records retention guidelines. With the start of the new fiscal year and with the conclusion of the Neighborhood Council Elections, it is a good time to review with your Board your Neighborhood Council's bylaws. Bylaws are established to provide a written framework and an organizational structure for the Neighborhood Council. The Department is accepting bylaw amendments until April 15, 2020. To vote on Neighborhood Council funding items, Neighborhood Council board members must have current ethics training and funding training. The Neighborhood Council bylaws may also require these trainings to vote for nonfunding items as well. To serve on a board, Neighborhood Council board members must also have either read and signed a Code of Conduct or have watched the video. To complete these trainings, please click [here](#).

NOTE: in person and online ethics training must be a minimum of 2 hours. If you complete the ethics training online, please ensure that you take 2 hours to complete the training as we will not accept any certificates that show less than 2 hours.

Funding - Eligibility to Vote on Financial Matters a. To be eligible to vote on any NC Expenditure, Financial Reports, and/or annual budgets, the board member must:

- Be an Elected, Appointed and/or Selected Board Member of the NC
- Be 18 years of age or older
- Have completed the California State Ethics Training Requirement for Local Officials (AB 1234)
- Have completed the online NC Board Member Funding Training and obtain a passing score of 70% on any test associated with the online course.
